17 For internal references use label-refs: see section 1. Bibliographic citations can be done with
18 "cite": refs. [1-3]. When possible, align equations on the equal sign. The package `amsmath`
19 is already loaded. See (1.1).

$$\begin{aligned}x &= 1, & y &= 2, \\z &= 3.\end{aligned}\tag{1.1}$$

20 Also, watch out for the punctuation at the end of the equations.

If you want some equations without the tag (number), please use the available starred-environments. For example:

$$x = 1$$

21 **2 Figures and tables**

22 All figures and tables should be referenced in the text and should be placed on the page
23 where they are first cited or in subsequent pages. Positioning them in the source file after

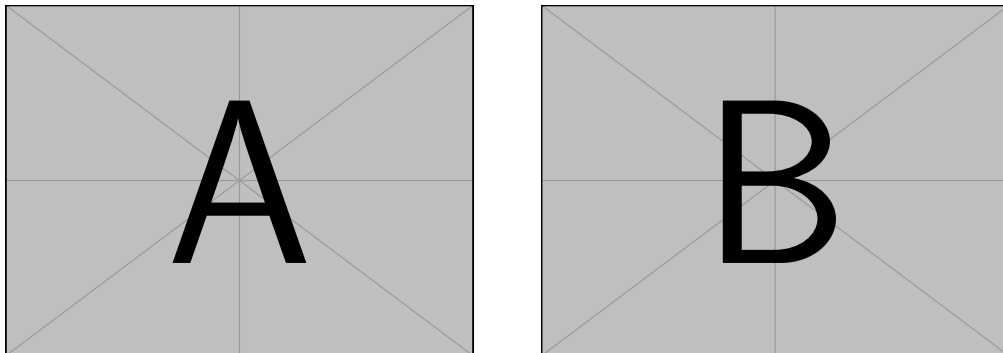


Figure 1. Always give a caption.

24 the paragraph where you first reference them usually yield good results. See figure 1 and
25 table 1 for layout examples. Please note that a caption is mandatory and it must be placed
26 at the bottom of both figures and tables.

27 We discourage the use of inline figures (e.g. `wrapfigure`), as they may be difficult to
28 position if the page layout changes.

29 We suggest not to abbreviate: “section”, “appendix”, “figure” and “table”, but “eq.”
30 and “ref.” are welcome. Also, please do not use `\emph` or `\it` for latin abbreviatons: i.e., et
31 al., e.g., vs., etc.

Table 1. We prefer to have top and bottom borders around the tables.

32 **Up to paragraphs.** We find that having more levels usually reduces the clarity of the arti-
33 cle. Also, we strongly discourage the use of non-numbered sections (e.g. `\subsubsection*`).
34 Please also consider the use of “`\texorpdfstring{\}{}`” to avoid warnings from the `hyperref`
35 package when you have math in the section titles.

36 **A Some title**

37 Please always give a title also for appendices.

38 **Acknowledgments**

39 This is the most common positions for acknowledgments. A macro is available to maintain
40 the same layout and spelling of the heading.

41 **Note added.** This is also a good position for notes added after the paper has been written.
